The green strategies are customized for the Greenbuild International Conference and Tradeshow and are categorized in the following five areas: air quality, energy efficiency, water conservation, waste minimization and environmental purchasing. These strategies focus primarily on site selection; a more complete set of guidelines will be presented further into the planning process.

Please note: MeetGreen<sup>SM</sup> Strategies should be offered at no additional cost to the organization. Preference will be given to sites with a maximum number of policies/practices in place. These strategies serve as minimally expected practices. Additional detailed strategies may be required. Compliance language to ensure implementation will be included in final contract.
